FAMILY SUPPORT SKILLS ACROSS PROFESSIONS AND SETTINGS

On Friday 10th of november 2023, from 13:00 to 14:00 (Brussels time), the usual EuroFamNet (European Family Support Network) (<https://eurofamnet.eu/>) **open online seminar** will be dedicated to "**Family support skills across professions and settings**". The event is hosted by the COST Action 18123 (EurofamNet), supported by COST (European Cooperation in Science and Technology) (<https://www.cost.eu/actions/CA18123/>).

In this edition, the 'Building Knowledge Exchange' section of EuroFamNet, which conducts these seminars/webinars, will be dedicated to sharing the last results of EuroFamNet's Working Group 4 (WG4). WG4 is entitled "**Developing a standardisation framework on skills**" (<https://eurofamnet.eu/working-groups/wg4>) and will share some results developed during the last period of the project, which focus on the **Catalogue of Family Support Skills**. Said catalogue, which was developed in collaboration between academics, professionals, practitioners, and stakeholders, try to identify and reach agreement on the set of skills classifications for family support workforce, required for quality performance. It is intended for professionals and stakeholders that work with families in different areas of work to improve skills and knowledge in family support.

The presentation of these results will be followed by the participation of a relevant respondent related to the topic. Afterwards the audience will have the possibility to interact with the speakers.
